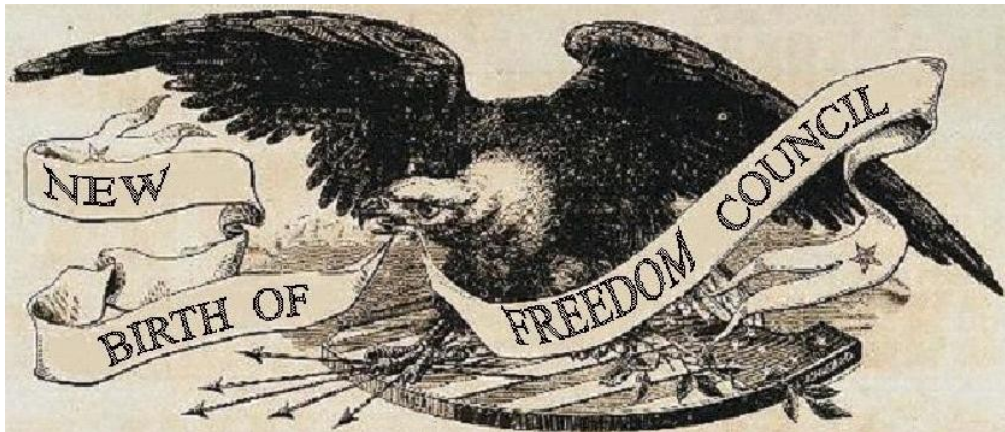


ADVENTURE DISTRICT FALL CAMPOREE!



CELEBRATING THE 150TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CIVIL WAR
OCTOBER 14-16, 2011 - CAMP CONEWAGO

This year's Adventure District Fall Camporee is a Grand Rally in celebration of the 150th anniversary of the Civil War. Camp activities, presentations, contests and campfires will be centered around this theme. In addition, this event will introduce Camp Conewago as a venue for future camping experiences at the troop and district levels. Units are strongly encouraged to invite the recently transferred Webelos Scouts to join in this camporee as well. REGISTRATION

Registration for the weekend is \$10.00 per person (adults, Webelos and Scouts). The fee includes use of the campground, a unit ribbon, as well as a patch for all attendees. Units should register by completing the attached registration form and mailing it to the Mechanicsburg service center. Units may also register by phone and then fax the form. Additional instructions are listed on the registration form. PLEASE NOTE: Registration is due NO LATER THAN September 6th, 2011. Troops will be designated as a Union or Confederate Company based on the order in which the unit's registration is received at the Council Service Center. Your unit leader will be notified via telephone and email by one of the District Activity Committee Co-Chairs or their designees of your association with the North or South.

TRAVELING AND ARRIVAL AT CAMP

Camp Conewago is located at 450 Boy Scout Road, New Oxford, PA 17350. Take US-15 South to the York Springs exit. Make a left to PA-94 South toward Hanover. Drive 7.6 miles and make a right onto Dicks Dam Road. Drive one mile, then turn left onto Boy Scout Road. PLEASE NOTE: Parking is limited; units are asked to carpool and condense gear as much as possible. Trailers need to be parked in the parking lot and gear hand-carried to the campsites (up to 200 yards from the lot). It is recommended that units bring a wagon or dolly to transport gear.



IN CAMP

Units are required to bring their own tents for camping. Water and Port-A-Johns are available for all campers. However, units will have to transport water from its source to their individual sites. Units must provide their own containers; again, dollies or wagons are highly recommended for movement of troop gear and water transport.

All cooking will be above-ground; no campfire pits are permitted in the unit campsites. Units must bring their own wood or camp stoves for cooking. If units choose to build fires in the common area, ashes must be placed in the cement pit behind the Rothrock cabins prior to leaving camp. Each unit will be responsible for packing out their garbage and recyclables.

The community area adjacent to the tent sites is perfectly suited for unit campfires and picnics, camaraderie, Scout skills, or just relaxing as it includes two campfire rings and picnic tables surrounded by plenty of shade trees!

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Medical forms for each attendee will be kept by the unit. Attendees need to stay out of the woods and any area that is not maintained due to a heavy growth of poison ivy. Also, use caution when walking near the dirt road bordering camp. Swimming will not be permitted.

UNIT COMPETITIONS



COMPANY FLAG COMPETITION

After receiving their Union or Confederate designation, units are invited to create a Company flag in keeping with the Camporee's theme. The unit flag shown here belonged to the 104th Regiment of Pennsylvania Volunteers and includes the Seal of the Commonwealth as well as battles the unit participated in. Maybe something similar, noting unit activities, will catch the judges' eyes?

Use your imagination to create a one-of-a-kind Company flag that best represents your unit! PLEASE NOTE: flags need to be completed prior to arrival at camp; supplies will not be provided at camp to create a flag.



COOKPOT STEW/SOUP COMPETITION

Is your unit's cooking known far and wide? Put your skills up against other units in the District! Troops are invited to participate in the Best Cookpot stew/soup competition using period recipes of their choice. Bring all of your own ingredients to cook that winning entry!

CIVIL WAR RE-ENACTORS

Civil War re-enactors will be present at various times during the event.

GEOCACHING

Scouts will have the opportunity to work on the Geocaching Merit Badge. Units are reminded to bring merit badge blue cards for their Scouts.

GAMES

Attendees are invited to try their skill at a number of Civil War-period and Scout-related games.

FISHING

Camp Conewago sits right next to Conewago Creek, offering attendees the opportunity for fishing. You are required to bring your own fishing gear, fish only in designated areas, and follow all PA fishing and license laws.

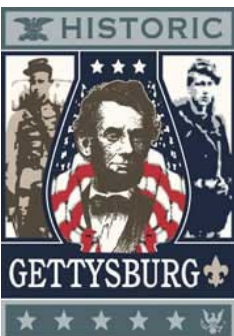
SERVICE PROJECTS

Units are encouraged to perform service projects at the campground to display our appreciation for the use of the facility.

REVEILLE, FLAG CEREMONIES AND CAMPFIRES

For roll calls, units should create a unique Company yell. Troop Buglers are invited to play reveille and taps. PLEASE NOTE: There is limited bench seating in the campfire; units should bring a tarp for additional seating.

GETTYSBURG

The town of Gettysburg is a 20-30 minute drive from Camp Conewago. Gettysburg and the surrounding area provides a number of opportunities for units. Be advised that there are fees associated with the attractions/venues in or around Gettysburg. Due to the narrow road leading in and out of camp, it is strongly recommended that units going to Gettysburg depart camp between 9:00-10:30 AM and return between 3:30-5:00 PM to reduce or prevent congested road conditions.

GETTYSBURG NATIONAL MILITARY PARK

7:00 to 8:30 AM Breakfast

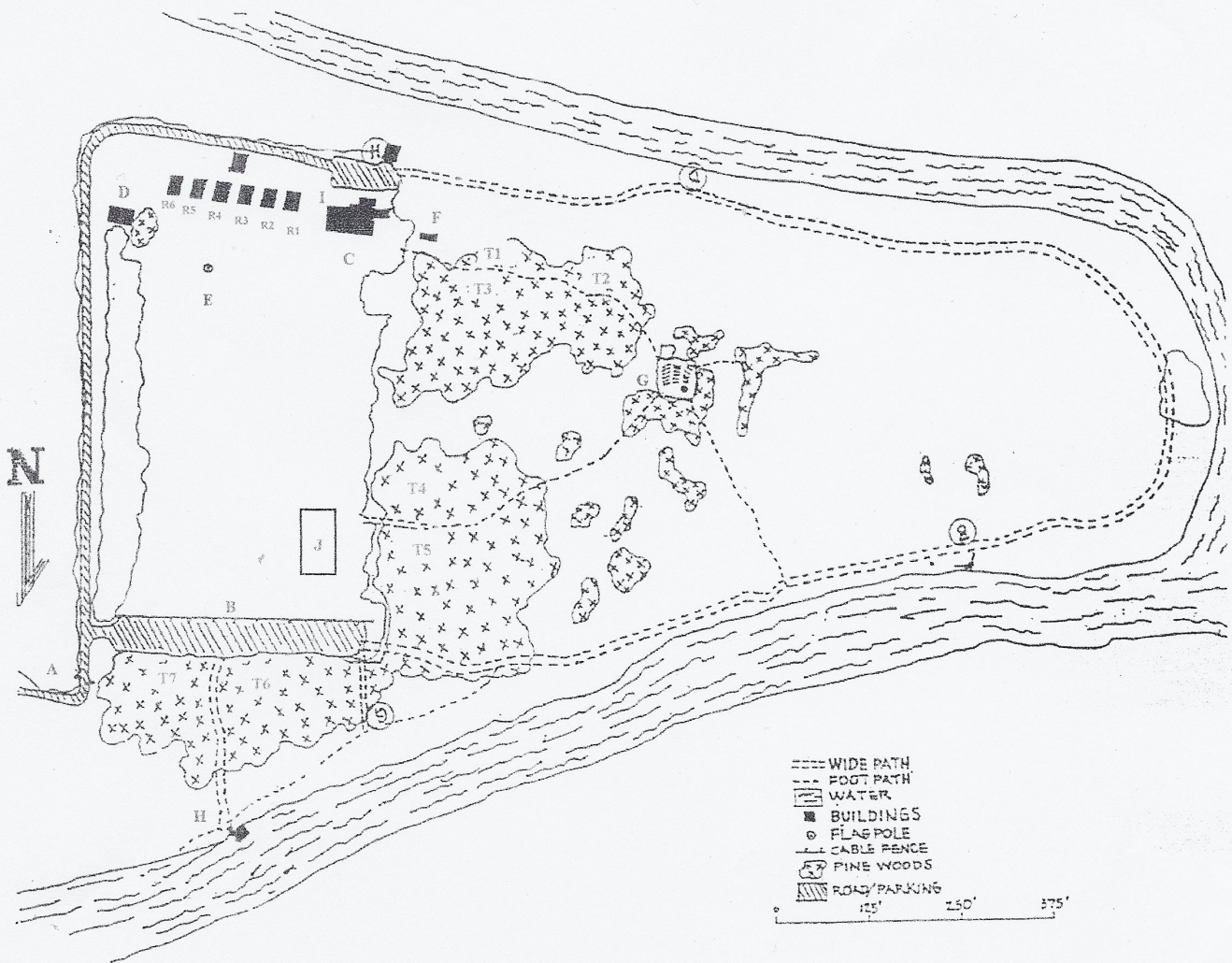
9:00 to 9:45 AM Non-Denominational church service
