Who can go camping?

Camp Tuckahoe welcomes all Cub Scouts, Webelos, and their adult partners! All Scouts must register for camp with their Pack or Den. Separate sessions for Cubs and Webelos allow us to offer programs especially designed for each.



Why should Scouts go camping?

- Boys become Scouts to go camping! Those who do are more likely to stay in Scouting!
- Our program facilities and equipment can't be matched by a unit on its own! Tuckahoe added nearly \$5 million in improvements less than 10 years ago!
- The Tuckahoe Staff provides enthusiastic instruction, ensures safe conduct, and engages every camper with a positive attitude!

What level of adult supervision is required? The Youth Protection Guidelines of the Boy Scouts of America require *at least two adult leaders* to be in camp with each unit at all times. We impose the additional requirement of *at least one adult for every eight Scouts*. We strongly encourage units to provide more supervision by ensuring at least one adult attends for every four or five Scouts.

Will there be opportunities to visit our Scout? Families and friends should visit on the last afternoon of their Scouts' stay. Join us for a barbecue and stay for the closing campfire! The barbecue costs just \$7 for each adult guest and \$5 for each guest between the ages of 6 and 11. Younger guests eat for free!

What will our Scouts do at camp?

Your Scouts will learn new skills, make crafts, complete rank requirements, sing songs, play games, and have a whole lot of fun!

Our campers rotate between program stations during their stay, earning awards along the way:

Archery	Nature
BB Shooting	Science Discovery
Boating & Fishing	Scoutcraft
Handicraft	Swimming

Second Year Webelos can also join our Tuckahoe Rangers program! Participants learn more advanced skills than younger Scouts. Tuckahoe Rangers also hike along the Appalachian Trail and shoot paintballs on our Wrist-Rocket Range!

Your Scouts will love hiking around Tuckahoe's 1300 forested acres, eating their meals in our air-conditioned Dining Hall, paddling on our lake, and swimming in our pool! They'll also enjoy our themed events:

The King's Tournament – Every Squire will prove himself through games of skill and games of chance! Your Scouts will be tried and tested as they strive against the barbarian invaders!

The Viking Sea Squall – The tables will turn when the barbarians invite our Squires to test their skills at a Water Carnival! There will be a dunk tank, slip-n-slide, and more water games to enjoy!

Search for the Holy Grail – Our Squires will scour the camp, hoping to find and claim the King's lost treasure!

How much does camp cost? We charge different fees for Scouts and adults, and we also offer an early reservation discount for those who pay in full by **May 1st!**

If a unit brings eight Scouts, two adults may camp for free. For every additional eight Scouts that attend, one additional adult camps for free!

A limited amount of financial aid is available for Scouts who qualify. Contact the Camping Services Office for more information.

How do we make our reservation?

To make a reservation for summer camp, your unit must complete a registration form and send it to Tuckahoe along with a non-refundable \$100 deposit.

When your unit attends camp you will have a choice of crediting this site deposit fee toward the balance of your summer camp fees or applying it to your 2013 summer camp reservation.

A \$35 non-refundable deposit for Cub Resident Camp and a \$60 non-refundable payment for Webelos Resident camp for each Scout and adult is due before April 1st. *A special, limited edition summer camp patch* will be given for each deposit made by April 1st.

While non-refundable, these deposits may be transferred to new Scouts or adults in your unit who had not yet registered for camp. The number of deposits made by April 1st will be used to allocate campsite space.
