

Cub Scout Adventure Camp COVID-19 Protocols

Masks

- **Fully Vaccinated Individuals**
 - “You are not fully vaccinated until 2 weeks after the 2nd dose of a two-dose vaccine or two weeks after a one-dose vaccine.”-CDC
 - Fully vaccinated individuals are not required to wear a mask.
 - Keep in mind all our Cub Scout age participants are not eligible for vaccinations at all.
 - **If vaccinated, please attach a copy of your COVID-19 vaccination card to your camp medical form.**
- **Unvaccinated Individuals**
 - All unvaccinated individuals will be required to have a face covering, however they will not be required to wear a face covering the whole time.
 - Areas that will require a mask will be designated with a mask up sign. These areas will include spaces that individuals are unable to properly social distance, indoors, or that the CDC designates as higher risk.
 - Areas that will not require a face covering are where you are able to properly socially distance such as travel between stations.

Sanitation and Handwashing

- Hand sanitizer will be available at each of the program areas.
- Frequent cleaning all multiple touched surfaces and objects will occur for example markers, BB guns, bows & arrows, and etc.

Check-In

- Camp staff will check everyone's temperature during a medical recheck each day at camp upon your arrival. Anyone with a temperature of 100.5 or higher will not be allowed to attend or stay in camp.

COVID-19 Communications

What happens if someone is symptomatic?

If a Scout, leader or staff member becomes symptomatic, they will be medically isolated and taken to the Health Lodge for further screening.

Our Camp Health Officer will decide (leaning to the side of caution) and send the individual home if necessary.

If an individual is sent home due to COVID-like symptoms, we will conduct contact tracing upon a confirmed Covid test result. Any unvaccinated individual who is deemed to have had close contact with the removed symptomatic individual may be removed from camp. "Close contact" is defined as someone who spends 15 minutes or more within six feet of a person with COVID-19 over 24 hours.

By following masking and physical distancing, policies will reduce the number of "close contacts."

What Happen if Someone Test COVID-19 Positive after Summer Camp?

While we make every effort to reduce possible exposures, it is possible that an individual who attends camp may test positive for COVID-19 after they leave camp. If that happens, once the camp is informed, we will email all unit leaders who were in camp with that individual to inform them of the positive test result. We cannot and will not inform others of the individual's name.
