GENERAL INFORMATION

The Battlefield District's Activities Committee presents the 2022 Klondike Derby, "To Seek and Save." This Camporee is for Arrow of Light Dens, Troops, and Crews.

Theme: This event will be based on the challenges faced by Search and Rescue Teams, particularly in the winterized backcountry. Saturday's program will consist of various search and rescue skills stations.

Patrols: Each patrol is permitted to have their own sled to move their equipment around the Klondike Derby with them. If your unit is planning to share one sled with two patrols, please have your Scoutmaster contact Chris Lontz or Herb Snyder so we can schedule the patrols together for the day. Please keep patrols to less than 10 members.

Registration & Check-In: The registration fee is \$10 per Scout, and \$5 per Adult (\$16 per Scout, and \$10 per Adult fee increase for late registration after January 23rd, 2022).

This fee includes program supplies, awards, participation ribbon, and event patch. Early Bird registration allows for us to have sufficient staffing, patches and supplies, thank you for understanding. Late registrants after January 23rd are not guaranteed to receive patches or other recognition items. Units that sign-up before the late registration date can add scouts and adults after January 23rd, but they will be charged the appropriate late fee. Lunch will not be provided at this event and units will need to bring and cook their lunch out on the trail or back at their campsite or cabin. Please have one adult check-in to complete your unit's registration and turn in your Roster on Friday evening by 8:30 PM or if your unit arrives Saturday morning, please check-in before 8:30 AM. Changes in registration will be corrected at that time.

Camping: Campsites will be available on a first come first served basis after 5:00 PM, Friday, February 18th. Campsites must be left in better condition than found. Cabins are available for reservation. All cabins are reserved for the Battlefield District units until November 22. After November 22, they will be opened to the public. To reserve a cabin before November 22, please contact Christopher Lontz.

Vehicles and Parking: Only vehicles and trailers carrying unit gear will be allowed to go to the campsites to unload. Vehicles carrying personal gear must go directly to the parking area and personal gear may be carried to the campsite. One trailer per unit may be unhooked and left in the campsite for the weekend. Trailer's wheels must be chocked, and you must use jack stands or blocks under rear of trailers. All vehicles must be parked in the parking areas. There will be no unauthorized vehicles permitted in the program area.

Trash: Units are responsible for removing all trash from the campsite.

Water: Water will be available throughout the weekend at the event. Please bring 5-gallon containers to store and carry your water.

Pets and Animals: Animals are not permitted except for service animals.

First Aid: First aid will be available during the event. Units may take care of minor injuries but must report all injuries to the first aid officer. Unit leaders are responsible for having a current BSA Health and Medical Record for each participant.

Health, Safety and Behavior: Leaders and parents are responsible for the health, safety, and behavior of all scouts in their care. Please provide sufficient leadership so Scouts are always supervised. If a situation warrants, individuals will be asked to leave the premises.

Uniforms: The BSA Field Uniform should be worn for worship services and campfire on Saturday evening.

Worship Services: Both a Catholic and a non-denominational worship service will be offered on Saturday evening. Please encourage all youth and adults to attend the service of their choice.

Recognition: There will be a presentation of the Klondike Grand Champion Traveling Plaque awarded to the top Scouts BSA Troop at the Campfire. The second and third overall Scouts BSA patrols will also receive a special, custom ribbon. The Arrow of Light dens will be awarded 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place ribbons (please note that we usually only have a couple Arrow of Light dens at this event, so the chances of earning a ribbon are pretty good). The first-place winners of the Scouts BSA and Arrow of Light sled race heats will also receive a trophy.

Units will receive their patches and participation certificates on Saturday at the Campfire Program. Units leaving on Saturday after the Program should inform Chris Lontz at registration to plan to pick-up your unit's patches before departing camp.

Check Out: Check out will be Sunday morning, 7:30AM – 11:00 AM. If you are staying in a cabin, you will need to have a Campmaster verify your cabin is in good condition before you leave.

Program Information: Each Patrol is expected to participate in each challenge throughout the day. Each Patrol will be issued a “program schedule” and a map with times and locations for each session. If a Patrol finishes earlier than scheduled, they must stay in the immediate area until it is time to move to the next one.

Sled Race: At the conclusion of the Saturday’s events, we will meet on the parade field for the Klondike Derby Sled Race. The patrol leader will come to the sign-in table and register for the big race. The Teams will consist of five members, four to pull and one to push your sled across the field. You will race in single elimination heats and the winners of each heat will race against the other winners until there is only one undefeated Team left. The winning Team will be determined as when the first sled and all five Team Member have crossed the finish line. No wheels for the race. (Wheels will be allowed for traveling throughout camp during the day’s activities) There will be both a Scouts BSA division & an Arrow of Light division.

Other Items: Each Patrol should review the Arrow of Light requirements or the Scouts BSA skills up through first class as the Program will be a real test of these Scout Skills. For more information see “Program Outline” Be sure to check the District website for possible up-dates.

There will be a Leader’s Meeting Webinar held via Zoom on Sunday, February 13, at 2:00 PM. Units should have at least one adult attending the event attend this webinar. This webinar will be recorded, so we kindly ask that no youth attend this webinar. A recording of this webinar will be posted to the District Website the next day for units to share at their meeting prior to the Klondike Derby.

Unit Roster and Registration: Please provide the staff a copy of your Unit’s roster (listed later in the Leader’s Guide) upon check-in Friday or Saturday morning. Registration must be done on Tentaroo (please indicate number of patrols when registering). Tentaroo will go live on October 20, 2021. It will remain open until February 11, 2022. On February 12, Tentaroo will close to any changes. Any changes that need to be made must be made through Christopher Lontz.
