Scouts, Webelos, and Cub Scouts, this year's spring camporee at McNaughton Family Park in Swatara Township! The Keystone Capital District Spring Camporee will be held from Friday, April 22nd to Sunday, April 24th for Scout troops and Webelos invited by a troop.

This year's event is a "Sports-a-palooza," stations filled with sports themed activities and games! There is a Saturday evening campfire, and Catholic Mass and Scouts Own Service will be offered as well.

Cub Scouts – Special late afternoon and evening activities starting at 4 pm. First Adventure set at 4:30-6 PM. Cub Scouts and their families will then have time to eat their picnic dinner brought at 6:00-6:30 PM followed up with the Second Adventure set at 6:30-800 PM

Then it's EVERYONE to the campfire to end the fun day's activities.

Members of the Order of the Arrow should pack their sash and join us for an OA Ice Cream Social immediately after the campfire. OA members should sign up to attend at https://tinyurl.com/oaicecream

Scout BSA Activities will be team based and most stations will be scored! Team sizes should be between 5 and 9, accommodations can be made for patrol teams of smaller or larger sizes. Each patrol team will be competing against a different patrol team at all of the challenging sports stations. Each station will be 40 minutes in duration with 5 minutes transition time (45 min. total per station). Not all stations will be scored, this will depend on rules used at each station.

Sports stations will include:

1. Volley ball: traditional rules and scoring

- 2. Nerf flag football: Touch football using Velcro red/blue belts
- 3. Whiffle baseball: baseball rules using plastic bat and whiffle ball
- 4. Punt/pass/kick team skills competition: Different skills for kicking and throwing a football for distance and accuracy
- 5. Track-n-field: 100-yard relay, long jump, shot putt and other events
- 6. Bucket brigade and tug-of-war: B.B. transfer maximum about of water during a set time and traditional tug-of-war team battles
- 7. 9-square In-the-Air contest: see photo below. Team rules will be used.
- 8. Horseshoes, Bocce Ball and possibly Corn Hole

Other general information:

Fires: All fires must be off the ground.

Trash: Pack it out. The park's trash containers are for other guests, all scout trash should be thrown away at the troop's camping area.

Water: There will be a water buffalo but not sure of its capacity and our camporee needs. It is advisable for troops to bring their initial water supply – A Scout is prepared. Thank you, SUEZ Water.

Latrine: Porta-potty – provided on-site. Hand sanitizer available, no hand washing stations.

Electricity: none available.

Medical: everyone must have Part A and B [kept by unit leader].

First Aid: individual first aid kit, unit first aid kit. Primary first aid is the responsibility of the individual and the unit. Individual units are responsible to receive, store and administer any medication. Refrigeration is not provided.

Weather: There is not a 'fixed sturcture' at the park, troops should be prepared for adverse weather by utilizing their own canaopies and pop-ups that are properly staked down for the potential of high winds.

Parking: McNaughton Park has limited parking. Do not park on grass areas unless instructed to so by Camp Staff. Be considerate when parking in the lot and allow for maximum parking of camporee visitors. Watch for instructions from Staff for allowable parking along entry/exit roadway. Two-way traffic must be maintained at all times on entry/exit roadway.

Behavior: Everyone should conduct themselves according to the Scout Oath and Law. Violators will be asked to leave.

Tobacco use & smoking: Adults must refrain from smoking or using tobacco products in the presence of or near any scout. Any youth caught smoking or using tobacco or vapor products will be asked to leave.

Dress Code: Activity uniform [Class B] for Saturday morning opening and Saturday campfire, Field uniform [Class A] for church services. No open toed footwear.

Off Limits: Swatara Creek, sanitation complex

DEPARTURE: Sunday am after site inspection, police area, pack out trash. Saturday after campfire for those units who need to depart prior to Sunday.
