Rules:

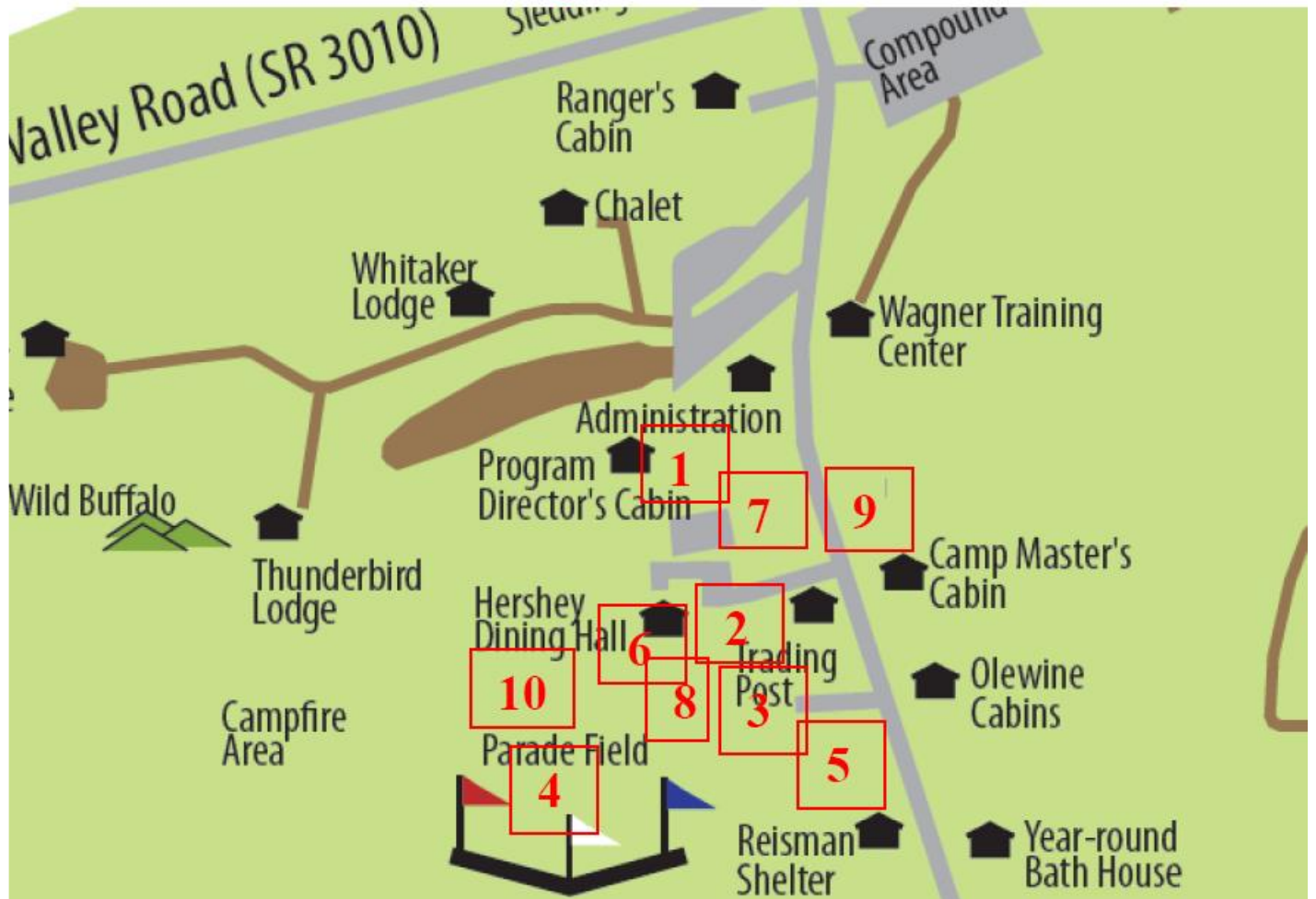

Optional Agenda: Each Unit Can Make Their Own Plans. We Are Offering This As A Reference To Any Pack Who Has Not Winter Camped In The Past at Hidden Valley Scout Reservation. Each Unit Can Decide on Coming Friday (Make Sure To Book A Cabin) or Come Up on Saturday For Program Events Only.

If you are camping for the weekend things we usually do in the cabin.

Show up at camp around 6:30 get all the scouts gear and food into the cabin and settled in. Around 7:00 eat supper usually something fairly easy like hamburgers and hotdogs. Usually me and the person cooking show up earlier to get some of the cooking gear and food there and start cooking for dinner. Around 8:00 we break the scouts up into patrols about 5 per Patrol 1 scout from each den if possible. Have the scouts come up with a patrol name and an emblem. You will need a piece of cloth around 36 × 36 folded in half and when done will get zip tied to a dowel rod 4 to 5 ' long. You will need to get cloth, dowel rod, and small zip ties for each patrol. You will also need color markers for the patrols to draw their emblem on their flag.

Each patrol needs on both sides of their flag.

I usually tell the patrols what they need on the flag 2 or 3 times then it's up to them to remember because they will be scored on what they have or don't have on their flag. If the scouts their flags done, they can learn a song or skit or make up a chant for their patrol to do Saturday evening.

The challenges are:

Stowing the gear, Sled pull , Ski race , Square knot rescue, Blind man lead, Rope & bungee challenge, Knowledge quiz, Map reading challenge

12:00-1:00 lunch

1:00-3:30 patrol challenges

4:30 - 5:00 hand out winner's trophies & closing

If you are camping for the weekend we have dinner around 5:00-6:00 and free time for little while. Around 8:00 we have the scouts doing their song, skit, and chant that they come up with when we are done with that we have a game of bingo until all the scouts win a prize with lights out around 10:45
