Arrival & Check-In



Program Details

Merit Badge Process

Attending the merit badge college does not guarantee advancement or merit badge completion. Each scout should select merit badges in consultation with their scoutmaster. Some merit badges are recommended for older scouts.

Each scout should be prepared to present an <u>Application</u> for <u>Merit Badge</u> "blue card", signed by their scoutmaster, to their merit badge counselor at the beginning of the session.

Each scout should review the merit badge requirements, pre-requisites (listed below) and the merit badge pamphlet in advance. All completed pre-requisites should be turned in to the merit badge counselor at the first session. If a pre-requisite is not submitted on time, the scout may receive a partial completion. A partial completion is acceptable; however, a scout may need to find another merit badge counselor after the merit badge college concludes.

Each merit badge requirement must be earned by each scout. Completion of a worksheet downloaded from the internet does not constitute completion of the

Merit Badges

Communications with Merit Badge Counselors:

Each scout should get in touch with their merit badge counselor between the two sessions with any questions. Reminder, all communications with merit badge counselors should comply with The Guide to Safe Scouting and Barriers to Abuse.

If all merit badge requirements are not completed, the scout may need to find another merit badge counselor after the merit badge college concludes.

Cell phones should be silenced throughout the event and only used with the permission of the merit badge counselor or in an emergency.

Scout Equipment:

- Pencil or pen.
- Notebook or paper.
- A merit badge pamphlet for each merit badge is recommended.
- List of the current merit badge requirements, revised as of January 1, 2025.

Uniform: The official BSA field uniform is appropriate. Uniform serves as a security measure and as your "meal ticket" in the dining hall.
